In 1961 their third daughter, Annette, was born and Jimmie decided to sell the restaurant to stay home with her girls. She became very active in church, teaching Sunday School, singing in the choir, church treasure, and cooking for various church events. She served under Pastor's Howard May and Gene Fields.
