**A**lvin Wayne Willmett, Sr. was born to Lewis and Nellie Willmett on March 30, 1924, in Hominy, Oklahoma, and passed away on April 19, 2013, in Citrus Heights, California at the age of 89. He was a painter by trade for all of his life and worked on the restoration of the capitol building in Sacramento in the early 1980's. Alvin was a World War II veteran and enjoyed a life full of traveling, country music, playing the mandolin and, most of all, spending time with his grandchildren.
